Broodmare Requirements

For mares to be eligible for the Iowa Horse Breeders' Fund Program and their foals to be eligible to enter races limited to Iowa-foaled horses, 21 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) chapter 62 requires, that the following must be submitted to IDALS **prior to foaling**:

- 1. A Broodmare Registration Application (Form M-4), including the \$30 registration fee.
- 2. The Mare Status Report (Form M-5)

Broodmares must establish residency in lowa for their foal to qualify for lowa Foaled Status. Residency is outlined in <u>lowa Administrative Rules Chapter 62</u>. There are several ways for a mare to establish residency. A summary is provided below:

- A Thoroughbred mare must arrive in Iowa on or before December 15th of the year prior to foaling and have continuous residency until the foal is inspected by IDALS. A Quarter horse or Standardbred mare must arrive in Iowa on or before January 31st prior to foaling and have continuous residency until the foal is inspected by IDALS.
 - A. To clarify: If a mare arrives in Iowa after the breed specific deadline listed above, then one of the following is required:
 - a. Be bred to an Iowa registered stallion
 - b. Be bred back to an Iowa Registered Stallion
- 2. Have 30 days residency in Iowa and be bred to an Iowa Registered Stallion
- 3. Have 30 days residency in Iowa and be bred back to an Iowa Registered Stallion

All mares are required to have a pre-foal inspection prior to foaling. All foals must have a post-foal inspection prior to leaving the state of lowa. For mares not in lowa prior to the breed specific deadline, there must be at least 30 days between the pre-foal and the post-foal inspection. *Call your inspector as soon as possible to schedule these inspections*. If you cannot reach your inspector, please call the Horse Breeding Program at 515-281-4103.

A mare status report must be submitted every year to IDALS in a timely manner regardless of if the mare is bred or open.
